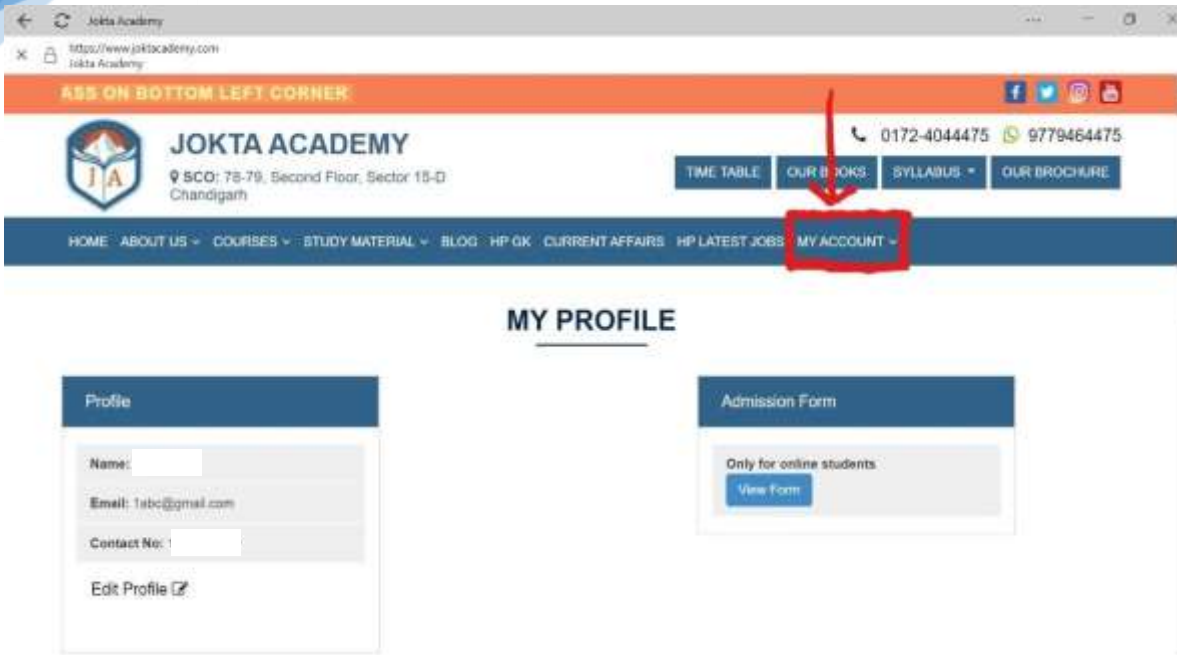
How to apply for registration and admission

To register on the website Applicants are supposed to follow the given steps

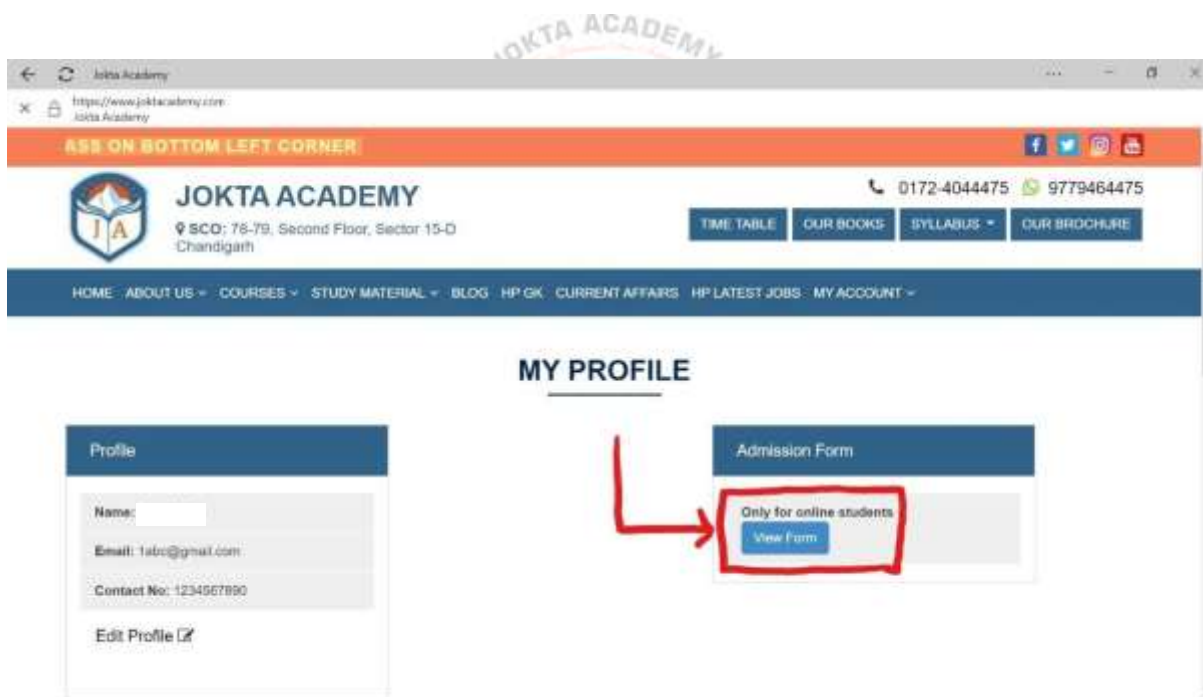
1. Open <https://www.joktacademy.com>

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Classes Programme and Syllabus

- We have divided the HPAS syllabus into two parts by keeping in mind the interlinkage availability of material and topics or subjects' importance for mains and prelims.
- In the first part, we have 7 topics/subjects which are important for prelims as well as mains.
